Inclusionary Zoning

Across Oregon, housing prices are out of reach for hardworking families and our neighbors on fixed incomes. Since 1999, local communities have been prevented from using an effective tool to ensure that the market offers affordable housing options.

In 2007, the Housing Alliance will ask the Legislature to lift the pre-emption that prohibits local communities from using the inclusionary zoning tool.
