We have a serious shortage of affordable housing

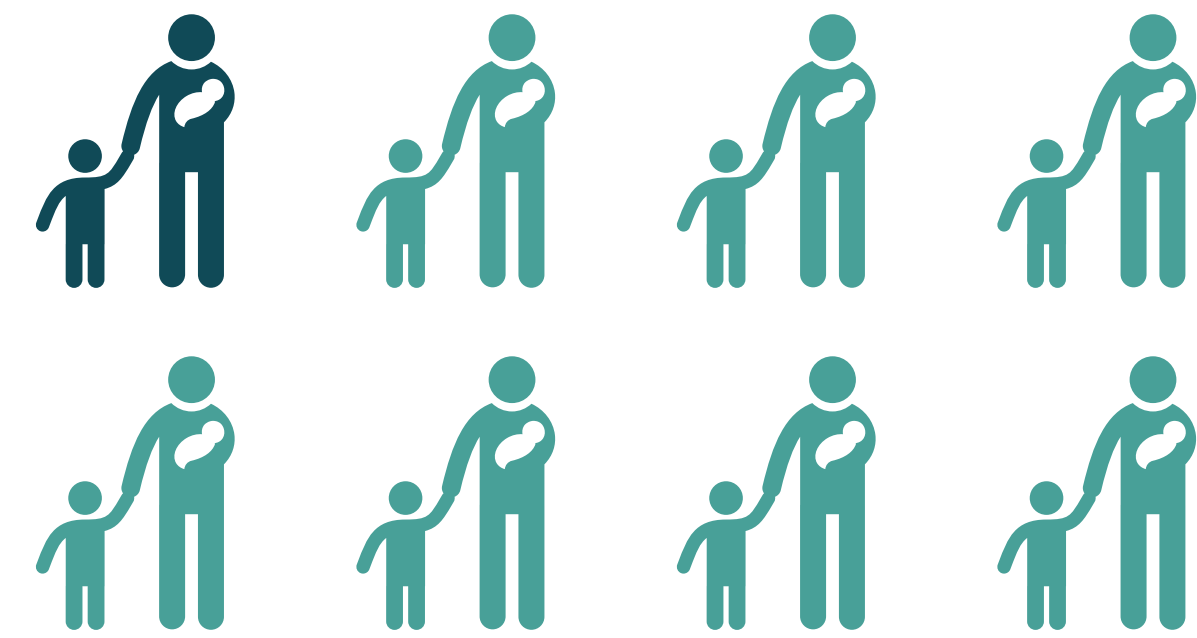
For every 100 families with extremely low incomes, there are only 38 affordable units available.

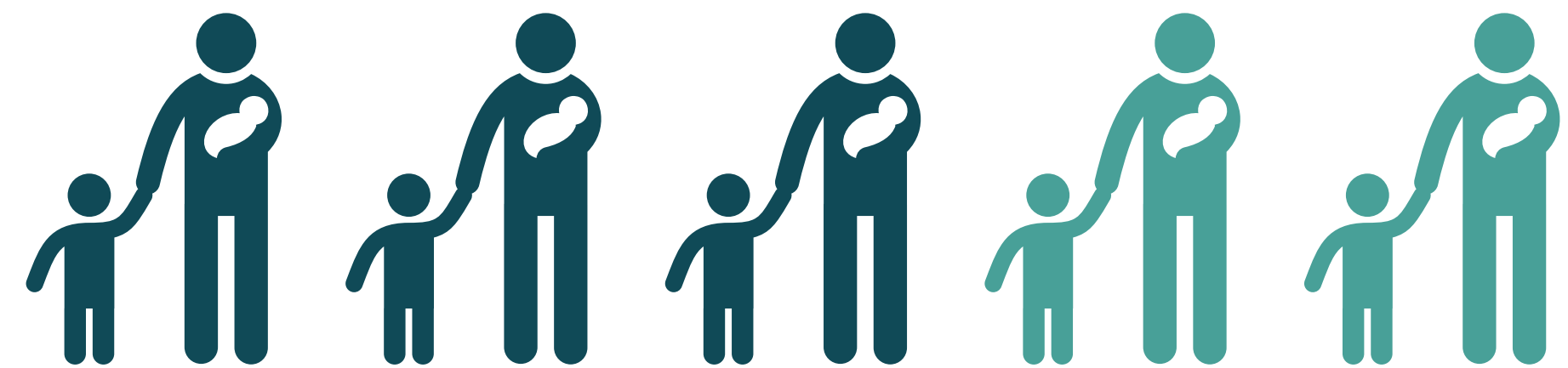

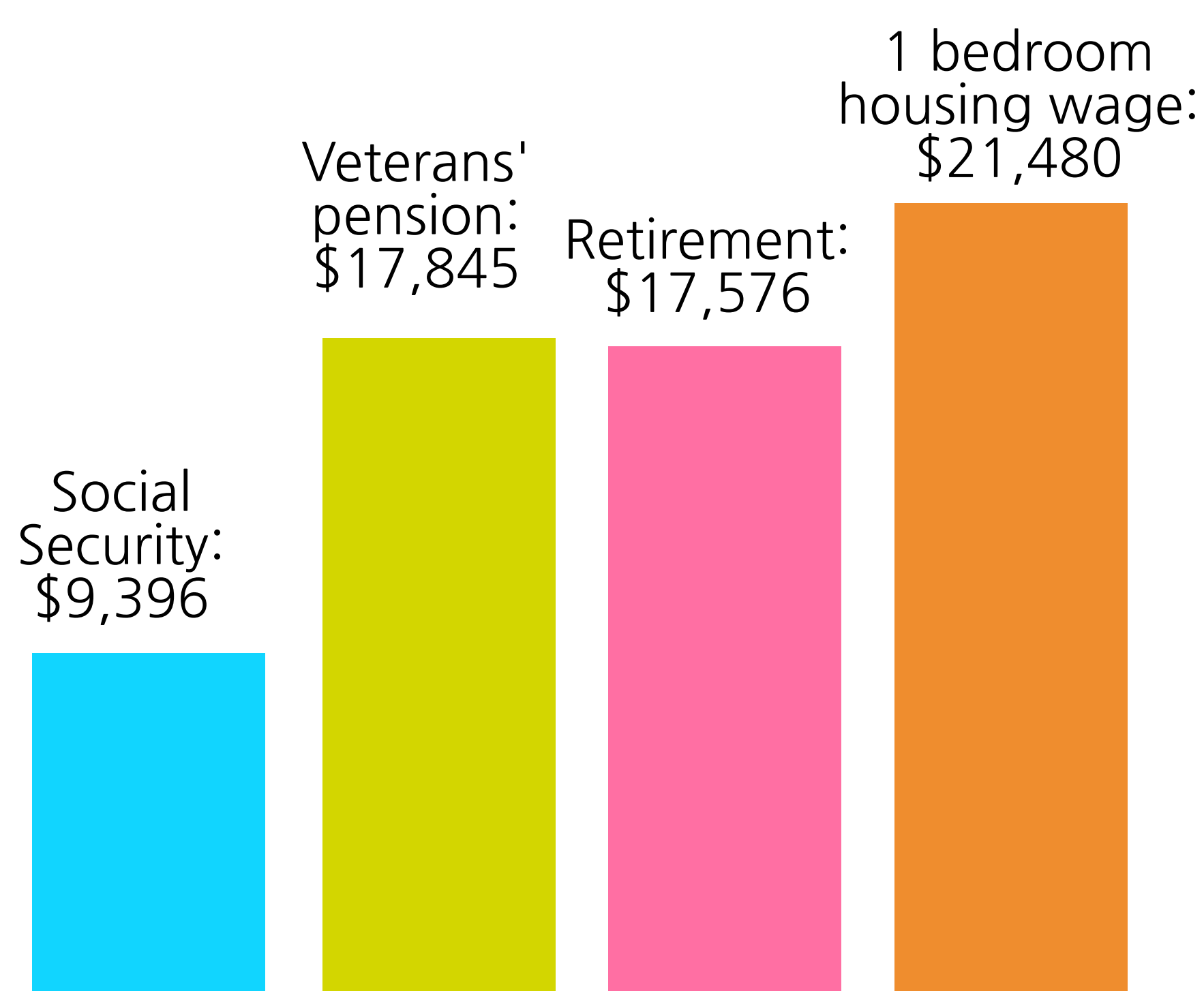

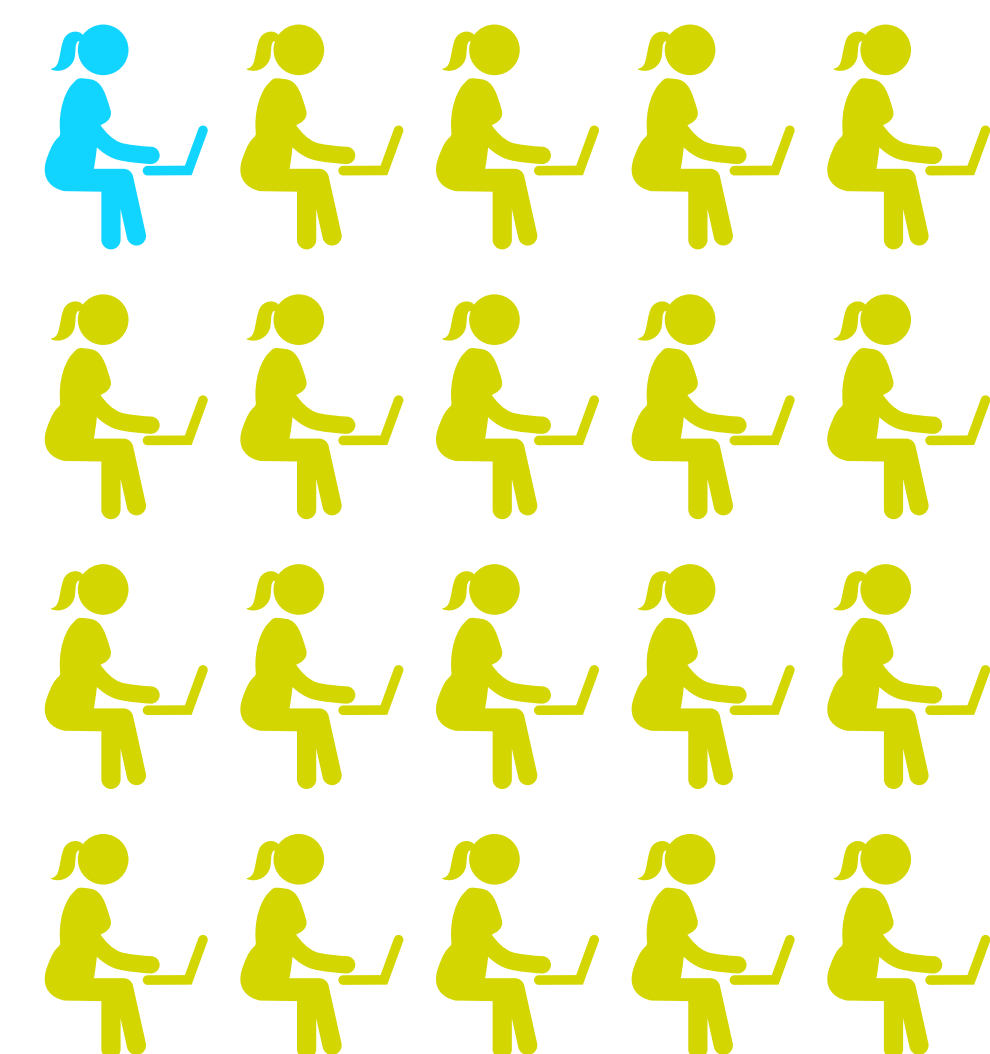
Our neighbors are facing homelessness



Oregonians on fixed incomes struggle to pay rent even for a one bedroom apartment.
