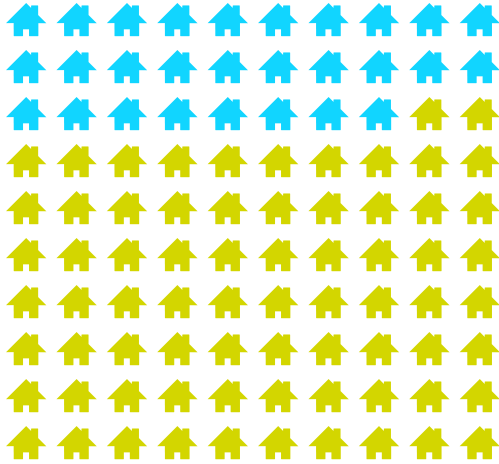


A Place to Call Home: Crook County

We have a serious shortage of affordable housing

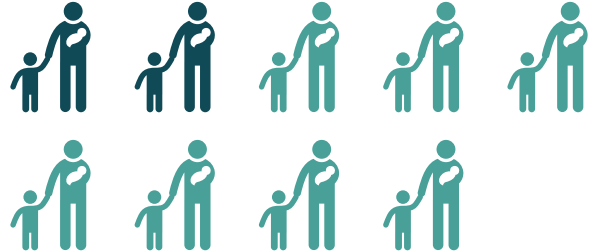
For every 100 families with extremely low incomes, there are 28 affordable units available.

2 out of 9



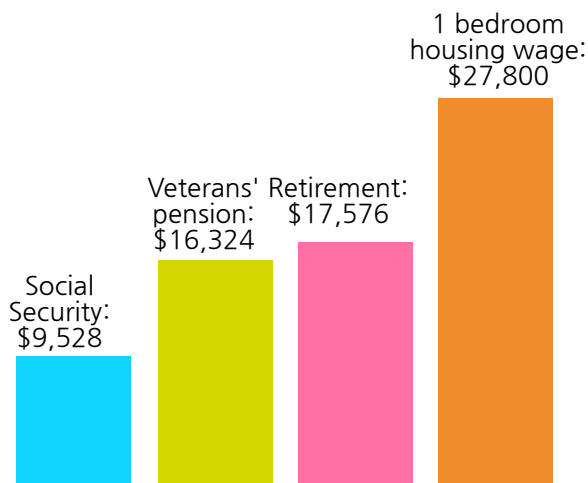
renters are paying more than 50% of their income in rent

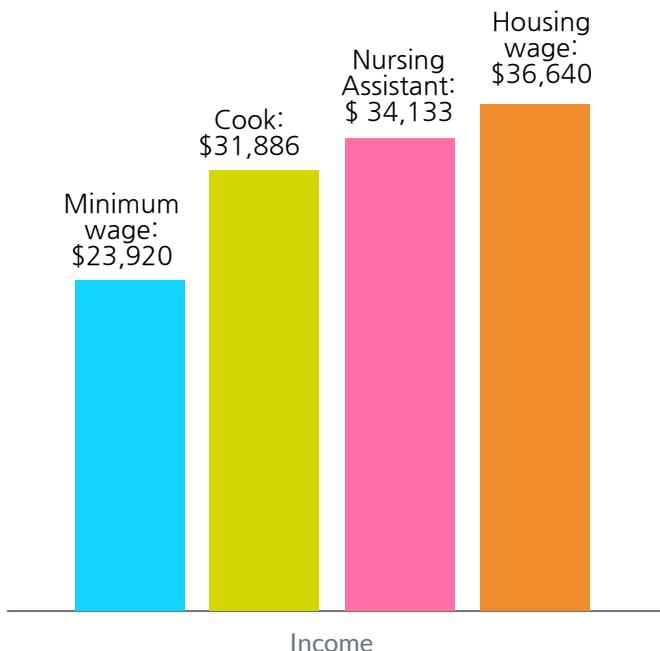


Mean renter wage

A household must earn at least \$36,640 to afford a 2 bedroom apartment at fair market rent.

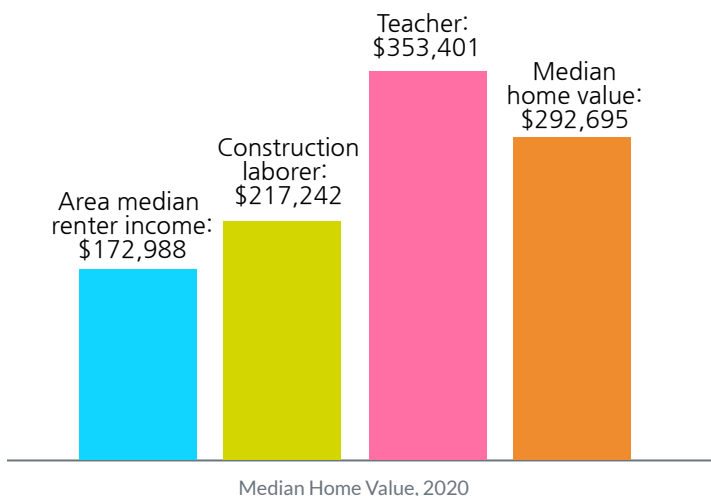


Homeownership is out of reach for many
