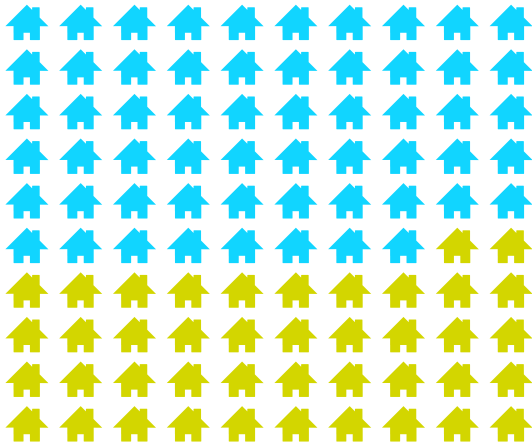


A Place to Call Home: Grant County

We have a serious shortage of affordable housing

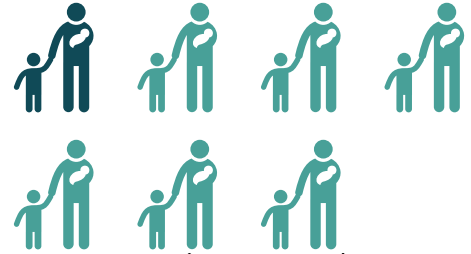
For every 100 families with extremely low incomes, there are only 58 affordable units available.

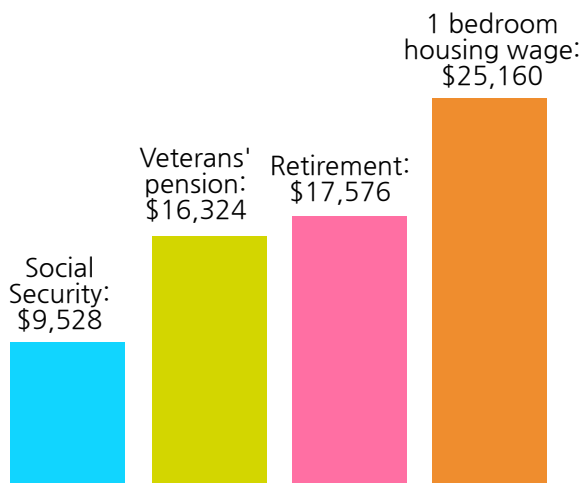

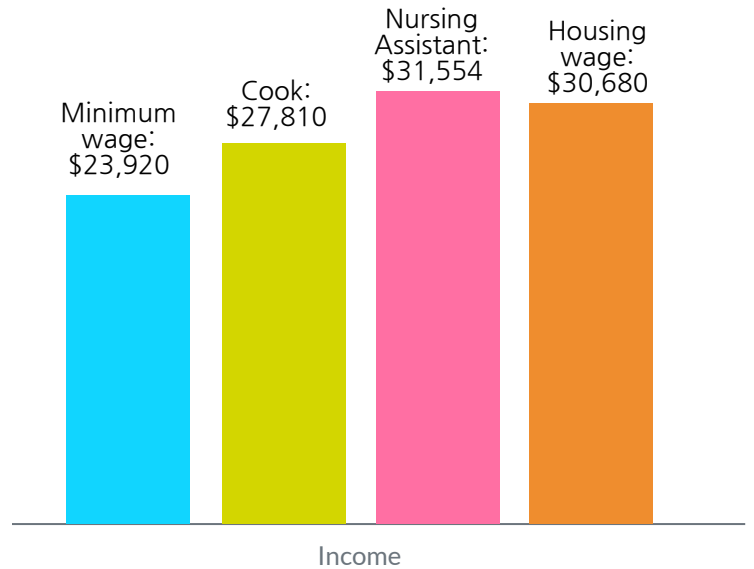


Mean renter wage

A household must earn at least \$30,680 to afford a 2 bedroom apartment at fair market rent.

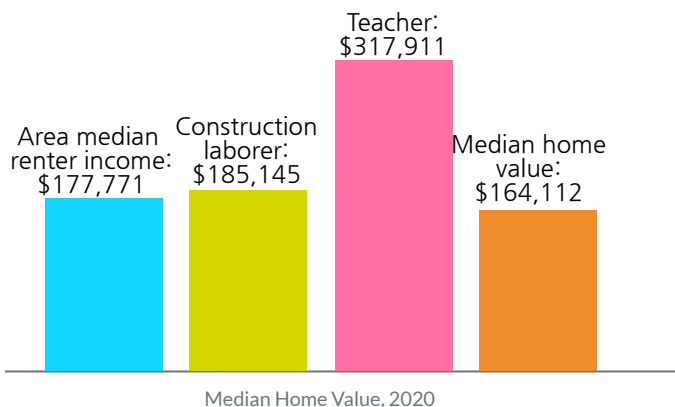


Homeownership is out of reach for many
