For every 100 families with extremely low incomes, there are only 21 affordable units available.

1 out of 4



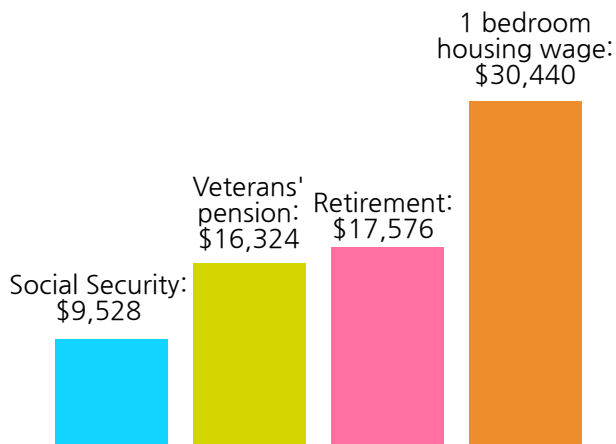
renters are paying more than 50% of their income in rent

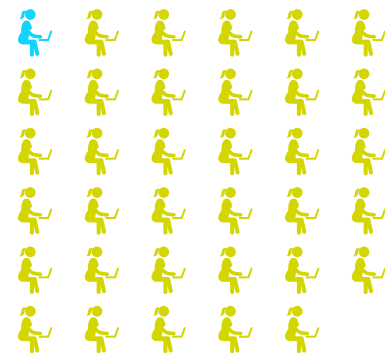
Our neighbors are facing homelessness

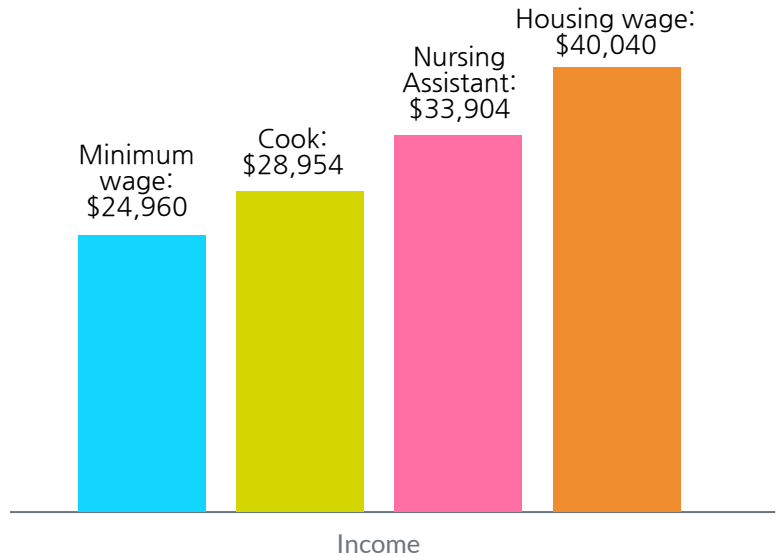


Mean renter wage

Number of hours per week at minimum wage needed to afford a 2 bedroom apartment

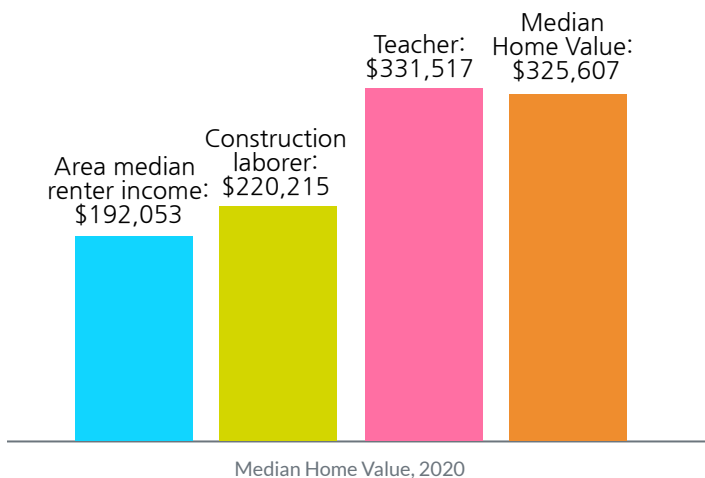


Homeownership is out of reach for many
